



Do You Know What to Do in The Event of a Leak?

The smell of leaking natural gas is often compared to rotten eggs. If you smell something resembling this, exit your property immediately. **When you arrive at a safe spot, call us at 1-800-673-3301 or call 911.** If you smell gas, DO NOT use electrical switches, appliances, garage door openers, etc. This can cause sparks.

Protect Your Home and Family From Accidental Fires

One of the best (and easiest) ways to keep your family and property safe is by keeping flammable materials away from gas appliances.

Never use or store flammable materials where a spark or flame could ignite them. Some examples of flammable items include gasoline, propane tanks, and paints/thinners.

When working with these materials, make sure you are in an open, well ventilated space. Store all flammable products in approved, nonbreakable containers that are tightly closed.

Warn all family members about the dangers of careless flammable liquid storage and thoroughly clean up any spills.

Damage Prevention

Electric power lines, natural gas pipelines, water pipes, communications lines, and other utility services can be within a few feet of the ground's surface. Not knowing where they are can result in personal injury, property damage, and neighborhood service interruptions. Even a small dent or a scrape can cause damage, resulting in a leak or service-wide disruptions.

If you're planning any type of excavation or digging activity, call 811 at least three full working days before starting. When you call 811, the national Call Before You Dig center will notify Liberty and other participating utilities, allowing us to mark our underground wires, pipes or cables so you'll know what areas to avoid. It's quick, it's easy, and it's the law!
